WX scholarships are awarded annually to students studying real estate at the graduate and undergraduate level. The primary consideration in awarding scholarships is academic merit and demonstrated interest in real estate through courses, clubs, internships and job experience. Financial need and the likelihood of working in the New York area are also taken into consideration. In addition to the financial benefit the scholarship provides, recipients benefit from mentoring opportunities and career guidance from WX members and can participate in a wide range of networking events offered by the organization.

Joanna Yu wins Inaugural ICSC Foundation Undergraduate Real Estate Award

Wharton student **Joanna Yu** won an International Council of Shopping Centers Foundation Undergraduate Real Estate Award on behalf of John Crossman. This new award program will annually provide 25 \$1,000 scholarships to a junior or senior enrolled in the undergraduate real estate program who exhibits a career interest in the retail real estate sector. This award is being offered to 22 U.S. universities and three in Canada. The program's two primary objectives are to help familiarize universities offering real estate as an undergraduate major with ICSC; and to build and strengthen relationships between the undergraduate real estate program and ICSC, as well as the ICSC Foundation.
