

DID YOU KNOW THAT...

There are 4,389 shopping centres in Canada. In 2001, total leasable retail area reached 343.3 million square feet.

In 2001, sales per square foot at enclosed malls were \$433, an increase of 1.2% over the previous year.

In 2001, shopping centres accounted for \$111.5 billion in sales, approximately half of all non-automotive retail sales.

Canadian shopping centres employed 1,209,400 people in 2001, 10% of total nonagricultural employment.

Canadian shopping centres collected \$6.41 billion in provincial sales taxes in 2001.

In 2001, there were 27 more shopping centers operating in Canada than in 2000.

The province of Ontario has the most shopping centres – 1,754.

The province of Saskatchewan has the least – 180.

PMB, a non-profit organization, and the J.C. Williams Group, a leader in retail consulting and research, estimates that 92% of Canadians (over the age of 12) visited a shopping mall in the past 30 days. On average, Canadians visit the mall 2.25 times per 30 days.
