Contributions to ICSC PAC will be used in connection with federal elections and are subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Federal Election Campaign Act. Contributions are voluntary and you have the right to refuse to contribute without reprisal. Guidelines for contributing are merely suggestions. You may contribute less than the guidelines suggest or nothing at all and you will not be favored or disadvantaged by reason of the amount of your contribution or your decision not to contribute. Only a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident Alien (i.e., a Green Card holder residing in the U.S.) can make a contribution. Federal law requires the PAC to use its best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation, and name of employer for each individual whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year. ICSC PAC cannot accept checks from the following: corporations; national banks; labor organizations; business entities with federal contracts; and foreign nationals.
